Environment

- AACO follows up on all regulatory, political and technical developments related to aviation and the environment on both global and regional levels. It also advocates the interests of member airlines. AACO handles environmental affairs through its Environmental Policy Group (EPG) which gathers environmental directors from all member airlines.
- The scope of the EPG group is to follow up on environmental developments affecting the Arab airlines, advocate their common interest, exchange environmental information, provide environmental awareness, and provide cost effective solutions that would help AACO members in facing the environmental challenges.

Future Distribution Strategies Task Force

- Aims at studying and researching the latest technological developments related to distribution techniques that meet the consumer needs at all touch points, and provides optimal exposure and reach of member airlines' products.
- It also aims at defining a comprehensive vision and formulating a strategy to deal with the distribution landscape beyond the year 2018 in light of the developments in this domain.

Fuel Project

- Fuel Project comprises the Fuel Steering Board (FSB) and the Aviation Fuel Advisory Group (AFAG).
- Consisting of 26 member airlines.
- A large number of fuel companies work within Aviation Fuel Advisory Group (AFAG) to spread awareness and ensure a safe and sustainable aviation fuel industry in the world in general and in the Arab world in particular.

□ Joint Cooperation at Outstations

The objective of the project is to maintain and enhance the quality of services delivered to member airlines at outstations while addressing cost issues, as well as improving the contractual terms with various service providers in the following domains:

- Ground Handling Services: Core of the project that addresses consolidating all ground handling services provided to operating member airlines at a particular outstation with prominent competent ground handler, if attainable and practicable
- Developments at outstations along with all related legislation
- Possibilities of cooperation in CIP lounges, check-in areas and other areas.

The current Ground Handling Agreements are with HAVAS in Istanbul and 20 other Turkish airports, Aviapartner in Rome, London Heathrow Terminal 4 with Azzura and Kuala Lumpur with KLAS and Malaysia airlines. The Board is constantly working on expanding the project to cover more stations as well.

□ AACO Regional Training Centers

The objective of AACO RTC is to provide AACO members a cost effective quality training, providing wide range of Aviation Courses, that maximize the performance of the human capital in the region such as Aviation Security, Safety, Cargo and Dangerous Goods Regulations, Airport and Ground operations, as well as selected Management courses in various management skills offered to its member Airlines, located in Amman main office and Cairo branch. To that end the RTC has been offering training in partnership with IATA, Edith Cowan University, McGill University etc. to maximize the outcomes of training.

AACO RTC also has adopted a strategy to promote customized in-house training activities that are cost effective which resulted in huge savings through training large numbers of airlines staff at their home base. RTC as well is offering consultancy services using the large available data base of individual consultants and consultancy houses, at very competitive rates.

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
